



## About Our Fundraiser

The Glymph Memorial Garden is the first African American park honoring the legacy of our "Black Business District" that was located on what is now Dr. L.M. Rosemond Lane and North Petty Street. Some businesses that were located in the district were Foster's Funeral Home, Edwards' Studio, James Harrison's Shell Gas Station, Eastside Cab Company and many more.

The late Clarence L. Glymph, Sr., who was the owner and operator of Glymph's Market, was the first African American to run for City Council in the early 1950's. He was a promoter of education and home ownership.

The Memorial Park will be located across from the former Glymph's Market on the corner of Dr. L.M. Rosemond and North Petty. The funds from this "Brick" project will be used for the maintenance of the park and the education of our children and citizens about the African American history here at home.
